Girls on the Run is a physical activity-based positive youth development program that inspires 3rd-5th grade girls to be joyful, healthy, and confident using a fun, experience-based, curriculum that creatively integrates running. The season is 10 weeks with 20 lessons that teach girls critical life skills. Girls will set goals and train to accomplish a celebratory 5K at the end of the season (April 18) with all Girls on the Run participants from Maricopa and Pinal counties. Healthy snacks will be provided at each lesson.

Participants meet twice a week, for approximately 90 minutes

Teams consist of 8-20 girls led by at least three trained coaches who guide the girls through 20 research-based lessons that creatively incorporate running and physical activity.

The season culminates with an end-of-season celebratory 5K event where all Girls on the Run participants throughout Maricopa & Pinal Counties come together, along with Running Buddies and members of the public, to celebrate their accomplishments.
